## SCHOOL MILK FOR ALL

School milk is available free or at a subsidised cost to all primary-aged children.

A portion of fresh, chilled milk at mid-morning break provides protein, calcium and other vital nutrients, important for your child's growth and development. It's also a great way to bridge the gap between breakfast and lunch, re-hydrating your child and helping them to concentrate in class.

If your child is currently under 5, s/he is entitled to receive free milk at school, funded by the UK Government's Nursery Milk Scheme.

Primary school children of 5 years and over have the option to pay for their milk at a subsidised cost. If your child (over 5) would like to start having milk daily, please visit www.coolmilk.com and select "Register your child for milk", then follow the on-screen instructions to register and pay, OR call/ email the school office to request a registration form. NB Children over 5 who are entitled to (means tested) Statutory Free School Meals (FSM) are also eligible to receive free milk daily. Please call/ email the school office before registering with Cool Milk.

Classlist is a totally free, secure digital platform that helps parents to connect with each other, successfully in use by parents at more than 1000 schools. Classlist acts as a 'virtual school gate', where you can make friends, ask for advice and recommendations, as well as arrange play-dates, school lift shares, fundraising activities and social events. Parents can also use the listings button to buy and sell personal items, such as second-hand musical instruments or to find a babysitter. And all of these services are available on one easy-to-use, modern platform.

While we're proud of the app's multi-feature versatility, Classlist's key function is to provide a directory of class parents accessible on all electronic devices, including mobiles. Parents can decide how much detail they want to share with other parents and Classlist is data protection registered and an approved supplier to PTA UK.

## SCHOOL LUNCHES


We have made some changes to our lunch menu as some of the options were not proving popular with the children, resulting in lots of food waste.
